

CCL/ESCC Football Film Exchange Guidelines

Rationale

The quality of film traded between teams should be fair and consistent.

Fundamental Requirements

- -Filming of varsity games should be completed by someone who has experience with a camera, by a professional company, or by an automated camera like Hudl Focus.
- -Use of a tripod or boom is required for overall stability, unless the camera is a mounted, automated camera.
- -The camera utilized should be either HD, a camera of high quality, or an automated camera.
- -All 22 players on the field should be visible on the film at the beginning of each play.
- -The zoom should be such that the periphery of the stadium is not a significant part of the filmed space (the bleachers, parking lot, buildings and roads adjacent to the stadium, etc.)
- -The zoom level should make it possible to read jersey numbers.
- -Any zooming during a play should be smooth.
- -Each play should be its own clip and must begin prior to the snap. The film should begin early enough to include shifts and/or motions. Each play should end a few seconds after the whistle.

CCL/ESCC Conference Film Trade By-laws

- -Only the wide (press box) film needs to be traded.
- -Two films are to be traded between each team. Opponents may request any two films from the current season.
- -Film exchange must be completed by 12 p.m. on the day after both teams have completed their previous game.
- -There is no permitted exchange or distribution of CCL/ESCC games outside of the 2 requested films exchanged between conference opponents.

The **only** exceptions: 1) exchanging film with an opponent in the playoffs or Prep Bowl 2) exchanging with a non-conference opponent on your schedule.
