## **Article 1 – Boys Baseball**

### **CONFERENCE BOYS BASEBALL COMMUNICATION**

#### **Section 1 – Website**

The East Suburban Catholic Conference maintains a website specifically dedicated to information, activities, results, and archives as they relate to the Conference events.

#### **Section 3 – Meetings**

The East Suburban Catholic Conference has scheduled meetings throughout the school year to facilitate the operation of the Conference and its activities.

Each school is required to present a knowledgeable representative to all scheduled meetings.

It is expected that the head coach of each conference school would make every effort to attend.

In the event there is a need to send a substitute, it is expected that the head coach will prepare the designee with necessary agenda and information so that each school will be represented in a positive manner.

#### **Section 4 – All Conference Selection Meeting**

The boys Baseball All Conference and post season meeting is scheduled for Sunday, May 23, 2010.

Contacts for this meeting are to be made by the Conference Secretary.

The meeting will be held at St Patrick High School and begin at 10:00 am.

#### **Section 5 – Results And Statistics**

The East Suburban Catholic Conference has designated Kevin Kelly (Marian Catholic) as the Conference Statistician.

Official team standings and game results will be kept in boys Baseball for the freshman, sophomore, and varsity levels of competition.

Team standings and game results will be posted on the East Suburban Catholic Conference website and will be updated as results become available through the Conference Statistician.

It is the responsibility of each head coach at the freshman, sophomore, and varsity level to FAX each game result to the Conference Statistician at the conclusion of each contested event.

Special forms have been prepared for the reporting of results to the Conference Statistician. They can be found on the East Suburban Catholic Conference website.

Results should be FAX immediately. If a contest has been cancelled or rescheduled, it is the responsibility of each head coach at the freshman, sophomore, and varsity level to identify that information to the Conference Statistician.

### **CONFERENCE BOYS BASEBALL ADMINISTRATION**

#### **Section 6 – Scheduling**

Scheduling of boys Baseball will be done by the Athletic Directors or their designees.

The Chairperson of the East Suburban Catholic Conference Athletic Directors will prepare a Master Contract that will contain all conference schedules for the succeeding year.

The Master Contract will be signed by the Principal and Athletic Director of each member school at the May Board of Control Meeting.

There will be a double round robin schedule for freshman, sophomore, and varsity teams.

The freshman and sophomore contests will be scheduled on the same day and time at the opposite site of the scheduled varsity opponent.

No East Suburban Catholic Conference game can be scheduled before the first Saturday of the conference season, which is the Saturday of Week 41 of the Illinois High School Association calendar.

If a game has to be changed due to an academic requirement, the game should be rescheduled as close to the original scheduled date as possible.

### **Section 7 - Eligibility**

The Rules of Eligibility of the Illinois High School Association shall apply.

Freshman level competition in boys Baseball shall be limited to students in their first two semesters after entering the ninth (9<sup>th</sup>) grade.

Sophomore level competition in boys Baseball shall be limited to students in their first four semesters after entering the ninth (9<sup>th</sup>) grade.

Varsity level competition in boys Baseball may include students in the freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior years of school unless individual operating procedures designate otherwise.

A player (contestant) in boys Baseball may not compete against a single school on more than one level of competition per conference scheduling period.

### **Section 8 - Starting Times**

The recommended starting time is 04:30 pm for all Baseball competition on weekdays.

The recommended starting time is 10:00 am for all Baseball competition on Saturdays.

A ten to fifteen minute warm up time is required for the visiting team.

### **Section 9 - Officials**

Two Illinois High School Association umpires are to be contracted for a varsity boys Baseball contest.

If only one umpire is available, the contest is to be played.

Two Illinois High School Association umpires are to be contracted for the freshman and sophomore boys Baseball contests.

If only one umpire is available, the contest is to be played.

The home team for the contest will pay for the officials regardless of the original site location.

### **Section 10 - School Information**

All Conference schools shall furnish the following information to the other schools at least one week prior to their scheduled varsity game.

Boys Baseball Information Sheet (as prepared by individual schools)

- Name of school,
- Name of principal,
- Name of athletic director,
- Names of varsity coaches,
- School colors;
- School nickname,
- Names of trainers and managers,
- Name of team physician.

Boys Baseball Roster (s) for all levels of competition (as prepared by individual school)

- Numbers (arranged numerically according to away jersey numbers);
- Names;
- Positions;
- Year In School;
- Height;
- Weight.

Any changes in players' numbers that may occur after the original roster (s) has been supplied should be corrected by the head coach to the opposing head coach and to the announcer prior to the start of the contest.

## **CONFERENCE BOYS BASEBALL HONORS**

### **Section 11 - Championships**

Championships in freshman, sophomore, and varsity Baseball will be determined on a percentage basis. In the event of a tie, co-championships will be recognized.

### **Section 12 – Team Awards**

A plaque will be awarded every year to the team champions or co-champions at the freshman, sophomore, and varsity levels according to the Conference standings.

### **Section 13 - All-Conference**

Certificates of Honor will be presented to an All-Conference team, as determined by the vote of the coaches of all member schools participating in Baseball.

Certificates will be prepared and awarded to the schools by the secretary. The number of certificates awarded for Baseball shall be determined by the Athletic Directors and has been set at twenty-seven - (27).

## **ALL CONFERENCE TEAM SELECTION PROCEDURES**

- a. Each Conference school will be represented on the All-Conference Baseball team.
- b. Coaches will first select the number of indicated position groupings according to the following order:
  - 4 Pitchers
  - 8 Infielders
  - 6 Outfielders
  - 2 Catchers
- c. Any team without representation will place its best player on the team. This player must have been nominated for another position.
- d. The remaining selections will be voted on as at large spots.
- e. All non-pitching nominations must have an average of 2.75 plate appearances in Conference games to be eligible for the team.
- f. Any player based on his offensive statistics could fill the Designated Hitter spot.

- g. Statistics to be used for All Conference nominations should be from conference games only.
- h. The following will be statistics that should be provided when nominating your players for All-Conference consideration:

Selection of All-Conference players will be done at the special meeting held immediately after the championship is determined.

The Baseball All Conference and post season meeting is scheduled for Sunday, May 23, 2010.

Contacts for this meeting are to be made by the Conference Secretary.

The meeting will be held at St Patrick High School and will begin at 10:00 am.

The Conference Secretary is responsible to publish the boys Baseball All Conference team.

There will be a copy of the boys Baseball All Conference team published on the East Suburban Catholic Conference website.

The Conference does not recognize Honorable Mention teams and will not publish or recognize any such selections.

**Section 14 – Special Post Season Conference Awards**

Excellence in boys Baseball will be recognized with the selection of a Player of the Year and a Coach of the year.

The Player of the Year of the Conference in boys Baseball will be the individual that receives the highest number of votes after nomination.

The Coach of the Year of the Conference in boys Baseball will be the individual that receives the highest number of votes after nomination.

A specially designed Conference Certificate of Honor will be presented to the Player of the Year and Coach of the Year in boys Baseball.

**CONFERENCE BOYS BASEBALL SPECIFIC RULES**

**Section 15 - Game Ball**

Any official top grade baseball is to be used with a minimum of three baseballs per game. A National or American League baseball is recommended.

**Section 16 - Special Regulations**

The ten run rule is mandatory in all contests.

The re-entry rule and the use of a courtesy runner for the pitcher and catcher shall follow state rules.

**Section 17 - Incomplete Contests**

All varsity tie contests that are official regulation games will be continued at the point where the game was suspended at the same sight on the first open date.

Sophomore and freshman official regulation tie contests will be determined on a .5 won and .5 loss basis in the standings and will not be replayed.

If any game (freshman, sophomore, or varsity) must be postponed because of rain, darkness, or other reasons, it is ruled a "suspended game" under provisions of Rule 4-2-3.

Any game that is not official regulation game (four and one-half innings if the home team is ahead or five innings if the visiting team is ahead) will be considered a suspended game and shall be continued from the point of suspension.

All sophomore and freshman official regulation incomplete contests will not be replayed. The winner in this case will be the team leading at the end of the last complete inning when the game was called.

**Section 18 - Postponed Contests**

The decision whether or not to play when weather and ground conditions are doubtful rest on the judgment of the host school.

Postponed contests are to be played the next day.

If games are continually postponed, they are automatically rescheduled in the order of postponement as set by the Athletic Directors.

State Tournament contests take preference over regularly scheduled Conference contests.

Regularly scheduled or rescheduled Conference contests will always take preference over regularly scheduled or rescheduled non-conference contests.

Conference teams are required to complete their conference schedule, but if late, in season, continued postponements occur; these teams need not play when mutually agreed upon unless any contest has a bearing on the Conference Championship.

In the event the host field is unplayable and the visiting location is playable, the contest is to be played at the available field whenever possible.

The varsity contest will take priority over lower levels with both fields and umpires.

This is followed in the priority of the sophomore level and the freshman level.

If a contest is moved to the alternate site, the umpires scheduled for the lower level contest will be used on the varsity level, only if the scheduled umpires for the varsity contest cannot be moved to the new location, and if the lower level umpires are determined competent to handle varsity level competition. This decision will rest with the assignment chairman for that school and the Athletic Director.

This also applies to double headers. In the event that both sites are not playable for a double header, then the contests are to be made up in a double header format at the site of the original host school or to be made up on individual days with both individual contests to be played at the site of the original host school.

In the event a contest is moved to the visitor's site from the original site due to field availability or playing conditions, the schedule remains intact for remaining contests.

Varsity contests are to be played first with sophomore and freshman contests following in priority. Varsity contests are to be moved to the first available playing facility.

#### **Section 19 - Double Headers**

Double headers will be scheduled in the East Suburban Catholic Conference. When a double header is scheduled, each team will assume the role of the home team.

The host school will be the home team for the first game, and the visiting school will be the home team for the second game. The doubleheader host school will supply baseballs for the double header.

Communication should take place concerning the amount of time between contests. It is recommended that fifteen minutes be allowed for necessary adjustments between contests.

A thirteen (13) game schedule has been formatted.

The sophomore and varsity will play at the site designated by the schedule.

The freshman will play at the opposite sites on Saturday following a Friday night contest or on a Monday following a Saturday night contest.

The schedule shall be counted backwards from the Monday before the Illinois High School Association Regional Tournament.

### **Section 7 - Eligibility**

The Rules of Eligibility of the Illinois High School Association shall apply.

Freshman level competition in boys Basketball shall be limited to students in their first two semesters after entering the ninth (9<sup>th</sup>) grade.

Sophomore level competition in boys Basketball shall be limited to students in their first four semesters after entering the ninth (9<sup>th</sup>) grade.

Varsity level competition in boys Basketball may include students in the freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior years of school unless individual operating procedures designate otherwise.

A player (contestant) in boys Basketball may not compete against a single school on more than one level of competition per conference scheduling period.

Freshman players can play a total of four quarters in both the "A" and "B" games on a given day. The seven pre-designated "A" team players may not play in the "B" game.

### **Section 8 - Starting Times**

The recommended starting time is 06:00 pm for all sophomore boys' Basketball competition.

The recommended starting time is 07:30 pm for all varsity boys' Basketball competition.

The recommended starting time is 05:30 pm for all freshman boys' basketball competition on weekdays.

The recommended starting time is 10:00 am for all freshman boys' basketball competition on Saturday.

Pre-game warm-up time for women's Basketball for freshman A, sophomore, and varsity have been set at twenty (20) minutes

### **Section 9 - Officials**

Three Illinois High School Association officials are to be contracted for a varsity boys Basketball contest.

Two Illinois High School Association officials are to be contracted for the freshman and sophomore boys Basketball contests.

### **Section 10 - School Information**

All Conference schools shall furnish the following information to the other schools at least one week prior to their scheduled varsity game.

## **CONFERENCE BOYS BASKETBALL HONORS**

### **Section 11 - Championships**

Championships in freshman, sophomore, and varsity boys Basketball will be determined on a percentage basis. In the event of a tie, co-championships will be recognized.

A team that does not play a full Conference schedule will not be considered for the championship.

### **Section 12 – Team Awards**

A plaque will be awarded every year to the team champions or co-champions at the freshman, sophomore, and varsity levels according to the Conference standings.

### **Section 13 - All-Conference**

Certificates of Honor will be presented to an All-Conference team, as determined by the vote of the coaches of all member schools participating in boys Basketball.

Certificates will be prepared and awarded to the schools by the secretary. The number of certificates awarded for boys Basketball shall be determined by the Athletic Directors and has been set at fourteen (14).

## **ALL CONFERENCE TEAM SELECTION PROCEDURES**

- a. Each conference head coach may nominate individuals according to the conference finish order. The following nomination totals can be made:
  - First Place Team – Five Nominations
  - Second Place Team – Four Nominations
  - Third Place Team – Four Nominations
  - Fourth Place Team – Three Nominations
  - Fifth Place Team – Three Nominations
  - Sixth Place Team – Three Nominations
  - Seventh Place Team – Two Nominations

Eighth Place Team – Two Nominations  
Ninth Place Team – Two Nominations  
Tenth Place Team – One Nomination

- b. Nominations are not based on conference statistics only, but can be on season statistics also. However, selection may be determined by conference performance.
- c. Schools that do not represent will not receive any consideration for the All-Conference team.
- d. There are no guaranteed spots for a school.
- e. Coaches can vote for all nominees other than their own nominations.
- f. The voting will take place with fourteen points awarded to the top pick and one point to the least pick.
- g. Total points will be calculated with the top fourteen selected individuals to be named to the All-Conference team.
- h. The individual that receives the highest number of votes in the balloting for All Conference will be named the Most Valuable Player of the conference.

Selection of All-Conference players will be done at the special meeting held immediately after the championship is determined.

The boys Basketball meeting is scheduled for Saturday, February 27, 2010.

Contacts for this meeting are to be made by the Conference Secretary.

The meeting will be held at St Patrick High School and begin at 09:30 am.

The Conference Secretary is responsible to publish the boys Basketball All Conference team.

There will be a copy of the boys Basketball All Conference team published on the East Suburban Catholic Conference website.

The Conference does not recognize Honorable Mention teams and will not publish or recognize any such selections.

#### **Section 14 – Special Post Season Conference Awards**

Excellence in boys Basketball will be recognized with the selection of a Player of the Year and a Coach of the year.

The criteria for the selection of the Player of the Year and the Coach of the Year will be developed by the boys Basketball coaches of the Conference.

The Most Valuable Player of the conference in boys Basketball will be the individual that receives the highest number of votes in the balloting for All Conference.

The Coach of the Year of the Conference in boys Basketball will be the individual that receives the highest number of votes after nomination.

A specially designed Conference Certificate of Honor will be presented to the Player of the Year and Coach of the Year in boys Basketball.

## **CONFERENCE BOYS BASKETBALL SPECIFIC RULES**

### **Section 15 - Length of Contests**

Length of quarters in freshman "A" and sophomore contests shall be seven minutes, and in junior varsity and varsity contests shall be eight minutes. In freshman "B" contests, the quarters shall be six minutes in length with a five-minute half time.

### **Section 16 - Uniforms**

The home team shall wear light colored jerseys, and the visiting team shall wear dark colored jerseys.

### **Section 17 - Game Ball**

The official Conference basketball will follow the State or Illinois High School Association regulations.

The host school at all levels of boys Basketball will be responsible for supplying boys basketballs to visiting schools for all warm up periods.

The host team at all levels shall provide the visiting team with a chalkboard or grease board with appropriate writing implements.

The host school at all levels of boys Basketball should supply the visiting team with water and a method to dispense the water.

### **Section 18 - Extraordinary Assistants**

The timing, scoring, and announcing positions at sophomore and varsity boys Basketball contests will be handled by adults.

An adult is defined as a member of the school's staff, when possible, or as parents, responsible alumni, or capable associates, when the need arises.

Pre-game warm-up time for women's Basketball for freshman A, sophomore, and varsity have been set at twenty (20) minutes

Three Illinois High School Association officials are to be contracted for a varsity girls Basketball contest.

Two Illinois High School Association officials are to be contracted for the freshman and sophomore girls Basketball contests.

### **Section 11 - Championships**

Championships in freshman, sophomore, and varsity girls Basketball will be determined on a percentage basis. In the event of a tie, co-championships will be recognized.

A team that does not play a full Conference schedule will not be considered for the championship.

### **Section 12 – Team Awards**

A specially designed Conference Certificate of Honor will be presented to the Player of the Year and Coach of the Year in girls Basketball.

During the first two invitational style meets, there will be unlimited entries in both the freshman-sophomore and varsity divisions, with only the top seven finishers from each team to count in team scoring.

### **Section 11 – Team Awards**

A plaque will be awarded each year to the team champions at the freshman-sophomore and varsity levels according to the results of the two invitational-style meet standings and the results of the conference meet.

### **Section 12 – Individual Awards**

Individual medals shall be awarded to the first nineteen (19) freshman-sophomore and varsity girls' finishers according to their Conference Meet finish.

Ribbons shall be awarded to the first nineteen (19) open division finishers in the girls Conference Meet.

### **Section 13 – Special Post Season Conference Awards**

Excellence in girls Cross Country will be recognized with the selection of a Player of the Year and a Coach of the year.

The criteria for the selection of the Player of the Year and the Coach of the Year will be developed by the girls Cross Country coaches of the Conference.

The Runner of the Year in the conference in girls Cross Country will be the first place medalist in the girls varsity Conference meet.

The Coach of the Year in the Conference in girls Cross Country will be the coach of the girl's varsity conference championship team

A specially designed Conference Certificate of Honor will be presented to the Runner of the Year and Coach of the Year in girls Cross Country.

## CONFERENCE GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY SPECIFIC RULES

### **Section 14 - Conference Meet**

A Conference Cross Country meet shall be held on the Saturday before the Illinois High School Association Regional Meet.

The course used for the East Suburban Catholic Conference Girls Cross Country meet must meet the Illinois High School Association guidelines for Regional competition.

The place and time of the Conference Meet will be determined by agreement of the Conference Athletic Directors each year, and the host school of the meet will conduct the meet in conjunction with the boys Cross Country Conference meet.

The order of races will be as follows:

- a. freshman-sophomore girls race;
- b. freshman-sophomore boys race;
- c. varsity girls race;
- d. varsity boys race;
- e. open girls race;
- f. open boys race

The meet shall have an official Illinois High School Association approved starter with a maximum stipend set at \$100.00.

The meet will be officially scored, using a program designed for running a Cross Country invitational, with a maximum fee for the scorer set at \$200.00.

The conference meet will be administered by a rules committee consisting of two coaches and the starter.

It is recommended that one of the coaches be from the host school, and the other from the following year's host school.

Varsity level competition in boys Football may include students in the freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior years of school unless individual operating procedures designate otherwise.

For the sophomore and varsity levels only, no player may appear in more than six (06) quarters per scheduling period. The following criteria to be followed:

- one play equals one quarter;
- this move can only be made from the sophomore to the varsity level;
- player (s) must be identified prior to the contest.

Except for the above situation, no contestant shall compete on more than one level per conference scheduling period.

Freshmen are eligible to compete at the varsity level.

### **Section 8 - Starting Times**

Sophomore contests shall start at 05:00 pm for night contests and 11:00 am for day contests unless mutually agreed otherwise.

Varsity contests must begin at 07:30 pm for night contests and 01:30 pm for day contests, or twenty minutes after the completion of the sophomore game, whichever of these times is later.

The varsity warm up time between the sophomore and varsity contests shall be limited to twenty minutes.

Ceremonies between halves shall be limited to fifteen minutes, except homecoming ceremonies, which shall be limited to twenty minutes.

### **Section 9 - Officials**

Five Illinois High School Association officials are to be contracted for a varsity boys Football contest.

Five Illinois High School Association officials are to be contracted for a sophomore boys Football contest.

Four Illinois High School Association officials are to be contracted for a freshman boys Football contest.

### **Section 10 - School Information**

All Conference schools shall furnish the following information to the other schools at least one week prior to their scheduled varsity game.

Any changes in players' numbers that may occur after the original roster (s) has been supplied should be corrected by the head coach to the opposing head coach and to the announcer prior to the start of the contest.

## **CONFERENCE BOYS FOOTBALL HONORS**

### **Section 11 – Championships**

Championships in freshman, sophomore, and varsity boys Football will be determined on a percentage basis. In the event of a tie, co-championships will be recognized.

A team that does not play a full Conference schedule will not be considered for the championship.

The Conference representative to the State Playoffs will be the team with the victory over the other team if they played each other during the Conference season.

In the event of a tie in the Conference standings and the teams did not play, or a tie between three or more teams, there will be co-champions, but the conference representative to the State Playoffs will be decided using the at-large selection formula that is outlined in the Illinois High School Association Football rules and regulations.

### **Section 12- Team Awards**

Plaques will be awarded to the team champions or co-champions in freshman, sophomore, and varsity competition according to the Conference standings.

### **Section 13 - All-Conference**

(For example, there are 02 all conference Quarterback's so every coach would give 02 points to the most deserving Quarterback and 1 point to the second choice. ## CONFERENCE BOYS FOOTBALL SPECIFIC RULES

### Section 15 - Length of Contests

Freshman Football contests are to be played with ten-minute quarters.

Sophomore and Junior Varsity Football contests are to be played with ten-minute quarters.

Varsity Football contests are to be played with twelve-minute quarters.

### Section 16 - Uniform

The home team shall wear dark or colored jerseys, while the visiting team shall wear white or light colored jerseys unless otherwise agreed upon.

### Section 17 - Game Ball

There is no official conference football. It should be noted that the Illinois High School Association mandates the use of a Wilson football in all playoff Contests.

### Section 18 - Extraordinary Assistants

Schools shall attempt to have a qualified doctor or medical personnel in attendance at sophomore and varsity boys Football contests.

The timing, scoring, and announcing positions at sophomore and varsity boys Football contests will be handled by adults.

An adult is defined as a member of the school's staff, when possible, or as parents, responsible alumni, or capable associates, when the need arises.

Exceptions to this would be if the home team rents the playing facility and has no control over the persons running the above positions.

An adult is defined as a member of the school's staff, when possible, or parents, responsible alumni, or capable associates, if the need arises.

The downs marker and chain crew should be trained adult personnel provided for the sophomore and varsity games by the home school.

The chain crew should operate the entire game from the side of the field opposite the press box.

### **Section 19 - Incomplete Contests**

Varsity, sophomore, and freshman tie contests will be broken according to the accepted tiebreak plan as designated by the Illinois High School Association.

### **Section 20 - Tie Break Method**

The method used to break ties and determine the Conference Champion will be as follows:

- Head to head competition result;
- Adding the total number of wins by all of the schools' opponents; the school with the most opponent wins will receive the berth;
- If there is still a tie, only the wins of each opponent beaten by the one or more than one tied team will be added, and the school with the most wins by a beaten opponent will receive the championship;
- Only the wins of each opponent to beat a tied team will be added, and the berth will go to the school having lost to the opponent (s) with the most wins;
- Should none of the previous steps determine the team to fill any remaining position (championship or at-large, the final step would be a flip of the coin arranged by the secretary of the Conference.

### **Section 21 - Video Exchange**

Each school will put its game film into the game vault at Game Film Solutions after every game. The film must be put into the vault on Friday night as soon as possible after the game, or if a team plays on Saturday afternoon, as soon as possible after the game. Each school must also email their game to next week's opponent so that they do not have to take the time to upload it from the system. Each school is allowed to pick and choose any or as many games as they want from the vault. If problems arise with the system and a school can not upload or download the film for any reason then that school must make arrangements with the school that they are playing that week to exchange film in person.

Video crews should try to show score board after every play or verbally give down, distance and yard line after every play.

The recommended starting time is 03:30 pm for all Conference Golf dual meet competition.

### **CONFERENCE GIRLS SOCCER SPECIFIC RULES**

#### **Section 15 - Length of Contests**

Length of contests shall be two forty minute halves for the varsity and two thirty five minute halves for the sophomore and freshman.

Length of contests shall be two forty minute halves for the varsity and two thirty five minute halves for the sophomore and freshman.

In the event the score is tied at the end of regulation time, there will be two five-minute, sudden-victory overtime periods contested.

The first team to score a goal during either overtime period will be declared the winner.

Matches may end in a tie (there will be no penalty kick resolution of the contest).

No tiebreakers of any kind are allowed at the sophomore or freshman levels.

#### **Section 16 - Uniforms**

The home team shall wear white jerseys, and the visiting team shall wear dark jerseys.

#### **Section 17 - Game Ball**

The official Conference Soccer ball will follow the State or Illinois High School Association regulations.

#### **Section 18 - Incomplete Contests**

In the event a game must be suspended because of conditions, which make it impossible to play, the referee shall

declare it an official and complete contest if one complete half or more of the contest has been played.

If less than .5 of the contest has been played, the contest must be rescheduled.

Wins are considered two points and ties, one point, for Conference standings.

The recommended starting time is 11:00 am for all Softball competition on Saturday.

A ten to fifteen minute warm up is required for the visiting team.

### **Section 9 - Officials**

Two Illinois High School Association umpires are to be contracted for a varsity girls Softball contest.

If only one umpire is available, the contest is to be played.

Two Illinois High School Association umpires are to be contracted for the freshman and sophomore girls Softball contests.

If only one umpire is available, the contest is to be played.

### **Section 11 - Championships**

Championships in freshman-sophomore and varsity girls Softball will be determined on a percentage basis. In the event of a tie, co-championships will be recognized.

### **Section 12 – Team Awards**

A plaque will be awarded every year to the team champions or co-champions at the freshman-sophomore and varsity levels according to the Conference standings.

### **Section 13 - All-Conference**

Certificates of Honor will be presented to an All-Conference team, as determined by the vote of the coaches of all member schools participating in Softball.

Certificates will be prepared and awarded to the schools by the secretary. The number of certificates awarded for Softball shall be determined by the Athletic Directors and has been set at thirty (30).

## **ALL CONFERENCE TEAM SELECTION PROCEDURES**

- a. Only the head coach (or representative, in case of emergency) will attend. If a school has no representative, its' nominations shall be withdrawn.
- b. The squad consists of the following 30 players:
  - 6 pitchers
  - 2 catchers
  - 12 infielders
  - 7 outfielders
  - 3 at-largePositions shall be voted for in the above listed order.
- c. At-Large: Individuals not selected as an all-conference position player. All nominated individuals not selected will be voted on for an at-large selection.
- d. Designated Hitter - The designated hitter will be considered an at-large entry and will need a minimum of thirty (30) plate appearances to qualify. All Conference nominations must have at least 30 plate appearances;
- e. Nomination Procedure
  1. Standardized forms will be sent out and returned one week before the scheduled all-conference meeting.
  2. Coaches shall nominate only their players by position.
  3. Nominations can be withdrawn at the meeting, but no players can be added.
  4. Nominees must have played half of the games at the nominated position (excluding pitchers).

- f. Preparation of Nominee Statistics
  - 1. Stats must be filed out before the meeting
  - 2. Nine copies made and brought to the meeting
  - 3. Stats of conference games only.
- g. Method of Voting
  - 1. Nominations will be written on board by positions before to meeting begins.
  - 2. Presentation of statistics will be in alphabetical order of schools for each position, with schools rotating after each position.
  - 3. Voting tally will be in alphabetical order of schools with rotation after each position.
  - 4. Voting will be written on paper, signed, and read by chairperson with identification of voter given. A coach CANNOT vote for their player.
  - 5. Votes will have numerical value according to the number to be rotated on team from that position.
  - 6. Once a player is voted on the team, that player cannot be voted to another position.
- h. All ties stand as voted
- i. All State or All-Area selection (continue rotation)
  - 1. Only all-conference selections eligible;
  - 2. Coaches cannot make nomination for any player;
  - 3. Oral vote (numerical order)
  - 4. Number agreed upon by coaches will be pushed for All-State consideration;
  - 5. All ties stand;
  - 6. Coaches vote for all players.

Selection of All-Conference players will be done at the special meeting held immediately after the championship is determined.

The Softball meeting is scheduled for Sunday, May 23, 2010.

### **CONFERENCE GIRLS SOFTBALL SPECIFIC RULES**

#### **Section 15 - Incomplete Contests**

All varsity tie contests will be replayed as newly scheduled contests.

All varsity partially played contests, except contests in the 4.5 or 5 inning rules, will be replayed as newly scheduled contests.

Freshman-sophomore regulation tie contests will be determined on a .5 won and .5 loss basis in the standings and will not be replayed.

All freshman-sophomore non-regulation tied or partially played contests will be replayed in their entirety.

All freshman-sophomore regulation incomplete contests will not be replayed. The winner in this last case will be the team leading at the end of the last complete inning when the contest was called.

#### **Section 16 - Postponed Contests**

The decision about playing when weather and ground conditions are doubtful rests on the judgment of the host school until the umpire takes charge of the contest. Postponed contests are to be played the next day, if possible.

If contests are continually postponed, the Athletic Directors should reschedule them in the order of postponement as set. State Tournament contests take preference over scheduled Conference contests.

Conference teams are required to complete their conference schedule, but if continued postponements are late in season, these teams need not play when mutually agreed upon unless any game has a bearing on the Conference Championship.

## **CONFERENCE BOYS TENNIS HONORS**

### **Section 10 - Championships**

The championships shall be determined by a combination of points resulting from the final standings of scheduled dual meets and from the final standing of the Conference meet.

Dual meet scoring shall allow one point for each match won. These points will be used in the determination of the league standings.

The maximum number of points for dual match competition will be five times the number of teams competed against in the Conference (45 points).

The Singles Player of the Year and Doubles Player of the Year of the Conference in boys Tennis will be the individual/doubles team that receives the highest number of votes after nomination.

The Coach of the Year of the Conference in boys Tennis will be the individual that receives the highest number of votes after nomination.

A specially designed Conference Certificate of Honor will be presented to the Player of the Year and Coach of the Year in boys Tennis.

**CONFERENCE BOYS TENNIS SPECIFIC RULES**

**Section 14 - Regular Season Play**

Each Conference team will play the other nine teams once in dual meet matches.

Each team will play two singles and three doubles matches on each level in the dual meets. These will be played on the same day at the same site.

If existing conditions dictate that a school not enters a full team for competition in a Conference dual meet, the opposing coach must be called at least one day prior to the match.

Dual conference matches will be scheduled on Tuesday and Thursday.

Rained-out matches must be rescheduled by the teams involved and should be played by the Wednesday before the East Suburban Catholic Conference Tennis tournament.

A ten-minute warm up period is usual. All practice serves should be taken during this time.

The players will dress appropriately for Tennis play (according to the terms and conditions for boy's Tennis published by the Illinois High School Association).

Team line-ups should be exchanged before the match. The guiding rule will be: "make the team as strong as you can without moving anyone downward."

The Varsity will use regulation scoring and play the best two of three sets.

The freshman-sophomore will use no-ad scoring and play the best two of three sets.

If a team arrives late and darkness becomes a factor, no – ad scoring will be used if both coaches agree.

If the score in a set reaches six all, the twelve-point tiebreaker will be used.

The Illinois High School Association Point Penalty System will be in effect during all Conference matches and also during the Conference tournament. The home coach will give the warning before the match, or at the beginning of the tournament.

The Illinois High School Association policy on coaching will be in effect.

All other Illinois High School Association and United States Tennis Association rules, regulations, and guidelines will apply.

**Section 15 - East Suburban Catholic Conference Tennis Tournament**

The East Suburban Catholic Conference boys Tennis tournament will be held on the weekend before the Illinois High School Association boy's Sectional tournament

The place and time of the Conference Meet will be determined by agreement of the Athletic Directors each year.

The East Suburban Catholic Conference Tennis tournament will be set up with brackets for First and Second Singles, and First, Second, and Third Doubles. The seeding and draw for the freshman-sophomore and varsity levels will be done on the Wednesday before the Conference tournament begins.

To be seeded in the Conference tournament unless a vote by the coaches is taken:

At SINGLES (first or second)

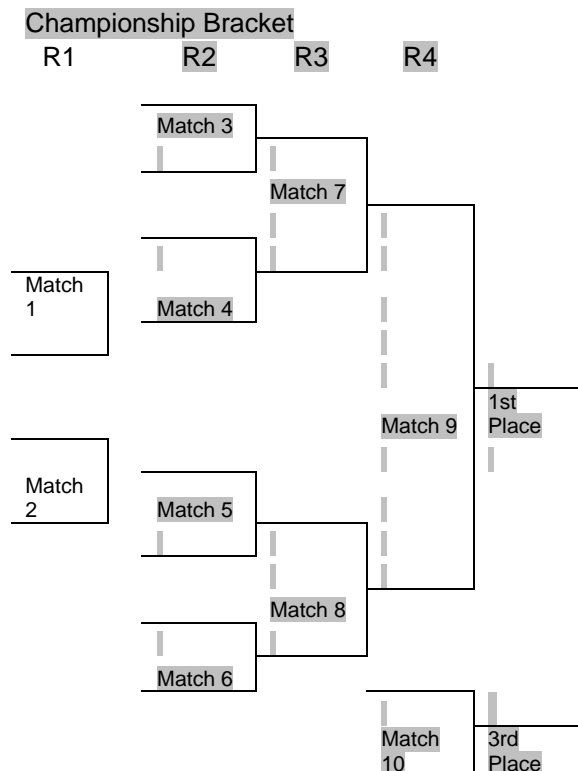
A player must have played a minimum of five matches at that position in the dual matches all on the same level. (Freshman-sophomore or varsity).

At DOUBLES (first or second)

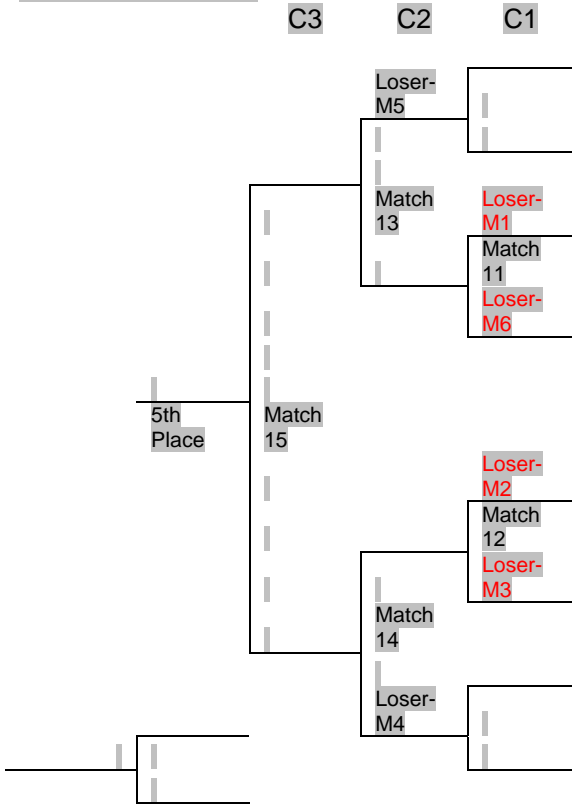
Each team must consist of two players that have played a minimum of five matches at that position (as a team) in the dual matches, all on the same level. (Freshman-sophomore or varsity).

## CONFERENCE GIRLS TENNIS SPECIFIC RULES

### Section 14 - Regular Season Play

Each Conference team will play the other 10 teams once in dual meet matches.

Each team will play two singles and three doubles matches on each level in the dual meets. These will be played on the same day at opposite sites.

If existing conditions dictate that a school not enters a full team for competition in a Conference dual meet, the opposing coach must be called at least one day prior to the match.

Dual conference matches will be scheduled on Tuesday and Thursday.

Rained out matches must be rescheduled by the teams involved and should be played by the Wednesday before the East Suburban Catholic Conference Tennis tournament.

A ten-minute warm up period is usual. All practice serves should be taken during this time.

The players will dress appropriately for Tennis play (according to the terms and conditions for boy's Tennis published by the Illinois High School Association).

The freshman-sophomore and varsity will use regulation scoring and play the best two of three sets.

If a team arrives late and darkness becomes a factor, no – ad scoring will be used if both coaches agree.

If the score in a set reaches six all, the twelve-point tiebreaker will be used.

The Illinois High School Association Point Penalty System will be in effect during all conference matches and also during the conference tournament. The home coach will give the warning before the match, or at the beginning of the tournament.

The Illinois High School Association policy on coaching will be in effect.

All other Illinois High School Association and United States Tennis Association rules, regulations, and guidelines will apply.

### Section 15 - East Suburban Catholic Conference Tennis Tournament

The East Suburban Catholic Conference girls Tennis tournament will be held on the weekend before the Illinois High School Association girl's Sectional tournament

The place and time of the Conference meet will be determined by agreement of the Athletic Directors each year.

The East Suburban Catholic Conference Tennis tournament will be set up with brackets for First and Second Singles, and First, Second, and Third Doubles. The seeding and draw for the freshman-sophomore and varsity levels will be done on the Wednesday before the Conference tournament begins.

To be seeded in the Conference tournament unless a vote by the coaches is taken:

At SINGLES (first or second)

A player must have played a minimum of five matches at that position in the dual matches all on the same level. (Freshman-sophomore or varsity).

At DOUBLES (first or second)

Each team must consist of two players that have played a minimum of five matches at that position (as a team) in the dual matches, all on the same level. (Freshman-sophomore or varsity).

There are no restrictions for third DOUBLES.

Any freshman or sophomore who has played in five matches on the varsity level must compete on the varsity level in the Conference tournament. In case of injury or illness, the coach should replace the injured or ill player (s) as accurately and ethically as possible according to the athlete's physical abilities in order to keep the varsity team as strong as possible.

\*A Bye will only be awarded a first round point if the player wins her first match.

### **Section 12 – Special Post Season Conference Awards**

Excellence in girl's Track and Field will be recognized with the selection of a Player of the Year and a Coach of the year.

The criteria for the selection of the Player of the Year for girl's Track and Field will follow this process. At the coach's seed meeting for the East Suburban Catholic Conference girl's Track and Field Championship meet, each coach will nominate one athlete from their team to be considered as the Athlete of the Year. Coaches will turn in their vote to the meet administrator by the end of the East Suburban Catholic Conference meet. Although the award will be titled Athlete of the Year, the coaches will actually be selecting an athlete of the meet.

The criteria for the selection of the Coach of the Year for girl's Track and Field will follow this process. Each varsity girl's Track and Field head coach will also list the name of his selection for the Coach of the Year. This name will be submitted along with the ballot for the girl's Player of the Year.

A specially designed Conference Certificate of Honor will be presented to the Player of the Year and Coach of the Year in girl's Track and Field.

The League Keeper program will be administered by the Athletic Directors of the East Suburban Catholic Conference.

#### **Section 3 – Meetings**

The East Suburban Catholic Conference has scheduled meetings throughout the school year to facilitate the operation of the Conference and its activities.

Each school is required to present a knowledgeable representative to all scheduled meetings.

It is expected that the head coach of each conference school would make every effort to attend.

In the event there is a need to send a substitute, it is expected that the head coach will prepare the designee with necessary agenda and information so that each school will be represented in a positive manner.

#### **Section 4 – Tournament Post Season Meeting**

The boys Wrestling tournament is scheduled for the following dates:

- Wednesday, January 27, 2010 (Seed);
- Friday, January 29, 2010 (Varsity);
- Saturday, January 30, 2010 (Freshman and Sophomore).

East Suburban Catholic Conference Tournament Seeding Meeting - This meeting will be scheduled for the Wednesday evening prior to the East Suburban Catholic Conference Tournament. This meeting will be hosted at Notre Dame High School. The meeting will be scheduled to start at 07:00 pm;

East Suburban Catholic Conference post-season meeting - This meeting will be scheduled for the Tuesday evening after the Illinois High School Dual Team State Tournament. This meeting will be hosted at Notre Dame High School. The meeting will be scheduled to start at 07:00 pm;

The boys Wrestling post season meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, March 9, 2010.

#### **Section 5 – Conference Meet Results**

The East Suburban Catholic Conference has designated Kevin Kelly (Marian Catholic) as the Conference Statistician.

Official Conference Meet results will be kept in boys Wrestling for the freshman-sophomore and varsity levels of competition.

Final team standings and Conference Meet results will be posted on the East Suburban Catholic Conference website.

The host school for the Conference Meet in boys Wrestling will be responsible to publish the results for the freshman-sophomore and varsity levels of competition.

Conference Meet results should be made available to the website host at the conclusion of the competition and those results will be posted on the East Suburban Catholic Conference website.

There is a particular presentation format for the results of the freshman-sophomore and varsity levels of competition for boys Wrestling.

The host school administrator should contact the website host for the presentation format for boys Wrestling.

## CONFERENCE BOYS WRESTLING ADMINISTRATION

### Section 6 – Scheduling

Scheduling of boys Wrestling will be done by the Athletic Directors or their designees.

The Chairperson of the East Suburban Catholic Conference Athletic Directors will prepare a Master Contract that will contain all conference schedules for the succeeding year. The Master Contract will be signed by the Principal and Athletic Director of each member school at the May Board of Control Meeting.

The member schools of the East Suburban Catholic Conference will conduct a single and double dual, round robin schedule, which will follow a three-year rotation at the freshman, sophomore, and varsity levels.

Double dual wrestling competition within the East Suburban Catholic Conference will begin at 05:15 pm.

The school that travels furthest will wrestle the host school in the first dual meet.

The school that travels furthest will wrestle the third opponent in the second dual meet.

The third opponent and the host school will wrestle in the third dual meet.

It is highly recommended that wrestling take place on three (03) mats when and where possible. It is understood that different facilities necessitate certain decisions. Administrators are highly encouraged to make an earnest effort to wrestle on three mats if at all possible.

A level of competition should be assigned to a particular mat. Each mat should run continuous dual meets until that level is completed. Adequate warm up time should be allowed between dual meets.

If a level finishes early, matches from another mat and level may be moved to the mat that has finished its level. Protocol dictates that both involved coaches agree to this move or the move should not be pressed.

### Section 7 - Eligibility

The Rules of Eligibility of the Illinois High School Association shall apply.

Freshman level competition in boys Wrestling shall be limited to students in their first two semesters after entering the ninth (9<sup>th</sup>) grade.

Sophomore level competition in boys Wrestling shall be limited to students in their first four semesters after entering the ninth (9<sup>th</sup>) grade.

Varsity level competition in boys Wrestling may include students in the freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior years of school unless individual operating procedures designate otherwise.

No contestant shall compete on more than one level per conference scheduling period.

A wrestler may only compete on one level of competition in the Conference tournament.

A wrestler may only compete on one level against one school during dual meet competition. A wrestler may wrestle two different levels against different schools during double dual competition.

### Section 8 - Starting Times

The recommended starting time is 05:15 pm for all freshman, sophomore, and varsity Wrestling competition using the double dual format.

### Section 9 - Officials

The East Suburban Catholic Conference will employ an officials' assignment chairman who will be responsible for assigning officials for double dual competition and for the conference tournaments.

Assignments are to be made for officials designated for certain levels of competition officiating.

Conference wrestling coaches are responsible for forwarding a composite listing of acceptable officials for their own school to be used in assignment of their meets.

The assignment chairman will make Officials Evaluation Forms available for conference coaches for the purpose of rating and evaluating assigned officials.

One Illinois High School Association official is to be contracted for a varsity boys Wrestling contest.

One Illinois High School Association official is to be contracted for a sophomore boys Wrestling contest.

One Illinois High School Association official is to be contracted for a freshman boys Wrestling contest.

## CONFERENCE BOYS WRESTLING HONORS

### Section 10 - Championships

The freshman, sophomore, and varsity championships shall be determined by the points awarded according to the teams' finishes in the Conference meet and the points awarded the

teams' places in the final standings for dual meets. In the Conference meet, a team finish will procure the following place points:

- first, twenty-four (24) points;
- second, twenty- one (21) points;
- third, eighteen (18) points;
- fourth, fifteen (15) points;
- fifth, twelve (12) points;
- sixth, nine (09) points;
- seventh, six (06) points; and
- eighth, three (03) points.

In the final standings from the dual meets, a team finish will procure the following point totals:

- first, sixteen (16) points;
- second, fourteen (14) points;
- third, twelve (12) points;
- fourth, ten (10) points;
- fifth, eight (08) points;
- sixth, six (06) points;
- seventh, four (04) points;
- eighth, two (02) points.

The Conference champions will be the teams at each of three levels with the highest combination of the two sets of points.

#### **Section 11 – Team Awards**

A plaque will be awarded every year to the team champions or co-champions at the freshman, sophomore, and varsity levels according to the results of the Conference dual meet standings and the results of the Conference meet.

#### **Section 12 – Individual Awards**

Individual medals shall be awarded to the first three placers in each weight class at the freshman, sophomore, and varsity levels.

An award will be given to the Most Valuable Wrestler at the East Suburban Catholic Conference Tournament. The head coaches at the championship meet will vote this award on.

#### **Section 13 – Special Post Season Conference Awards**

Excellence in boys Wrestling will be recognized with the selection of a Player of the Year and a Coach of the Year.

The criteria for the selection of the Player of the Year and the Coach of the Year will be developed by the boys Wrestling coaches of the Conference.

The Most Valuable Player of the conference in boys Wrestling will be the individual that receives the highest number of votes in the balloting for All Conference.

***Criteria will need to be developed in the 2009-10 school year for the Coach of the Year recognition in boys Wrestling.***

A specially designed Conference Certificate of Honor will be presented to the Player of the Year and Coach of the Year in boys Wrestling.

### **CONFERENCE BOYS WRESTLING SPECIFIC RULES**

#### **Section 14 - Conference Tournament**

The East Suburban Catholic Conference will conduct individual conference wrestling tournaments at the freshman, sophomore, and varsity levels. The tournaments will be

conducted one week prior to the Illinois High School Association Regional Tournament.

The place and time of the Conference meet will be determined by agreement of the Athletic Directors each year and the designated hosts of the Conference meets will be responsible for conducting the tournaments.

The weight classes, format, and scoring for the varsity level tournament will be the same as the Illinois High School Association for the current year. Wrestling will take place in the following weight classes:

103 Pounds - 112 Pounds - 119 Pounds - 125 Pounds –  
130 Pounds - 135 Pounds - 140 Pounds - 145 Pounds –  
152 Pounds - 160 Pounds - 171 Pounds - 189 Pounds –

The weight classes, format, and scoring for the sophomore level tournament will be identical to the varsity tournament with the exception that there be a wrestle back round to fifth place. The freshman and sophomore East Suburban Catholic Conference will wrestle back to fifth place during their conference tournaments. The wrestle back should take place from the semifinalists with cross-bracketing occurring. There should be automatic advancements (walk over). Scoring will take place to sixth place. Awards will be given to third place. Wrestling will take place in the following weight classes:

The freshman and sophomore East Suburban Catholic Conference will wrestle back to fifth place during their conference tournaments. The wrestle back should take place from the semifinalists with cross-bracketing occurring. There should be automatic advancements (walk over). Scoring will take place to sixth place. Awards will be given to third place. Wrestling will take place in the following weight classes:

The varsity Conference tournament will be wrestled on a Friday, one week prior to the Illinois High School Association Regional Tournament. The varsity Conference tournament will be scheduled to start at 03:30 pm. Weigh-in time will be designated from 01:30 pm through 03:00 pm. Scratch meetings will be held (as necessary) during the time between the weigh-in and the designated starting time.

The sophomore Conference tournament will be wrestled on a Saturday, one week prior to the Illinois High School Association Regional Tournament. The sophomore Conference tournament will be scheduled to start at 09:00 am. Weigh-in time will be designated from 07:00 am through 08:30

am. Scratch meetings will be held (as necessary) during the time between the weigh-in and the designated starting time.

The freshman Conference tournament will be wrestled on a Sunday, one week prior to the Illinois High School Association Regional Tournament. The freshman Conference tournament will be scheduled to start at 09:00 am. Weigh-in time will be designated from 07:00 am through 08:30 am. Scratch meetings will be held (as necessary) during the time between the weigh-in and the designated starting time.

Meetings will be conducted on the Thursday prior to the conference tournament to seed the freshman, sophomore, and varsity level tournaments. The seeding meetings will be conducted at the centrally located Notre Dame High School in Niles, Illinois, and will begin at 07:00 pm. A general meeting should be conducted to discuss tournament procedure and to answer pertinent questions. Three meeting areas should be designated for freshman, sophomore, and varsity level coaches to convene and to seed the three level tournaments.

An award will be presented to the student-athlete named the "Outstanding Wrestler of the East Suburban Catholic Conference Varsity Wrestling Tournament." The student-athlete will be selected by vote of the varsity coaches at the varsity conference meet. Each coach will vote for three individuals. The first listed position is worth three (03) points, the second listed position is worth two (02) points, and the third listed position is worth one (01) point. The "Outstanding Wrestler of the East Suburban Catholic Conference Varsity Wrestling Tournament" will be named from this voting process.

Each Conference school will be responsible for a forty-dollar (\$40.00) entry fee to the host school of each level of the East Suburban Catholic Conference Wrestling Tournaments.

### **Section 15 - Conference Tournament Criteria**

1. Record versus common opponents (including head-to-head)
2. Returning champion or runner up in the same weight class
3. Quality of competition
4. Season record
5. Vote of coaches who have wrestlers in the same weight class

#### **EAST SUBURBAN CATHOLIC CONFERENCE SEEDING CRITERIA FOR WRESTLING**

1. Conference record which includes head to head competition (This is the eight dual meets in our schedules)
2. Season record (Overall record)
3. Record versus common opponents
4. Returning champion or runner up in the same weight class as last year
5. Vote of coaches who have wrestlers in that weight class

(Obviously #04 does not fit the freshman level and might not fit the sophomore level)

When figuring a wrestler's record, it should be done at the weight class that he is going to enter. A wrestler's overall

record is every match he has wrestled. It should be understood that when a wrestler comes down in weight class (say from 112 pounds to 103 pounds), his record should also come down with him. However, the converse is not true for a wrestler going up a weight class (say from 112 pounds to 119 pounds). The record at 112 pounds does not go up. In order to have a seed, a wrestler must have three matches in the Conference.
